Older Adults

Getting older can be a challenge

Mental illness can make the challenge of growing older seem even tougher. An estimated 15-25% of older adults struggle with behavioral health problems that threaten their independence, family relationships and recovery from other illnesses.

Consider the following:

- Older adults are at-risk for substance misuse and abuse, including alcohol and other drugs, and prescription and over-the-counter medications
- Because they are likely to believe depression is a normal part of aging, 75% of depressed older adults fail to seek treatment
- Older adults sometimes cope with anxiety and other mental health issues by avoiding contact with others and becoming socially isolated.
- The physical problems of many older adults contribute to their isolation. Isolation increases their mental health symptoms.
- Americans 65 and older are disproportionately likely to die by suicide. The suicide rate of this population is 31% higher than that of the general population.
- Studies indicate that older adults without appropriate physical and mental healthcare have shorter life spans.

Addressing these challenges requires unique expertise.

A specialized, personal approach for older adults

Staff of TAMHO member organizations identify symptoms and develop individualized treatment plans for older clients. They coordinate mental healthcare with physical healthcare and other resources, using proven effective care models.

Services for Older Adults include:

- Medication evaluation and management-including prescription assistance if needed

INTAKE PROCESS

All appointments for intakes are scheduled through the Centerstone Central Intake & Referral line by calling 615-460-4357 in Davidson County. Outside of Davidson county, please call 1-888-291-4357.

All children, including those in state custody, must be accompanied by their legal guardian. Individuals 16 years of age and above may sign their own intake paperwork and releases on information. However, unless such a youth is living independently, we request that the guardian still attend the appointment, sign all paperwork, and be an active participant in the treatment planning process.

In cases where a child is living with someone other than their parent, documents verifying custody and the custodian's ability to consent for medical treatment need to be brought to the intake appointment. Such documentation will also be needed when a child is living with their parent but a custodial dispute is documented.

The legal guardian must be available during the intake process to answer any questions regarding information they might either have or have access to.



The legal guardian must attend psychiatric appointments both to help provide information and because their signature is required for consents for the use of psychotropic medications.

It is extremely helpful if social histories and copies of any recent evaluations can be made available to the intake clinician. The legal guardian needs to be available to sign all required updates to the needed paperwork (information releases, treatment/service plans, crisis plans, etc.). These are typically updated every six months at a minimum. The parent or guardian must be present for the duration of the intake session in order for Centerstone to complete assessment and initial treatment.

INTAKE PROCESS

To schedule an initial appointment, call the Cherokee Health Systems office closest to you, or call our main office number: (423) 587-7337. The scheduling secretary will need name, address, phone number, legal guardian, social security number, insurance information, and primary concerns. An initial appointment is usually scheduled in less than two weeks.

The child must be with the legal guardian for the initial appointment, in order to complete paperwork. Children in the custody of the Department of Children Services must be seen first with their DCS case manager, or with a DCS representative with legal rights to sign paperwork. We will need written history (social history) prior to the appointment to avoid wasted time. It is essential that we know the child's history before we begin treatment.

INTAKE PROCESS

Intakes are completed on Tuesday and Thursday mornings.

Exception: A DCS caseworker may designate another individual to accompany the client to the intake as well as sign all necessary paperwork. A copy of this form for this process is in the DCS Handbook or the DCS caseworker can contact Dr. Johnson.

The intake interview process is a minimum of 90 minutes and depending on the number of intakes presenting, consumers should be prepared to spend a minimum of 2 hours and up to 4 hours.

Should the DCS worker identify special issues presenting difficulty in meeting the above time elements and/or the presentation of a legal guardian, he/she should contact Dr. Johnson to discuss alternative scheduling and/or a plan.

The DCS worker is strongly encouraged to present any previous social history and/or psychological reports to assist in the treatment planning.

Should the DCS caseworker or any referral source experience difficulty with the above intake system or service delivery they should immediately contact Dr. Johnson, Ms. Andreoli, or Ms. Bell; listed above.

TennCare Referrals and Private Referrals

Consumer calls Frontier Site for appointment. Consumer is advised they may be seen the next scheduled open intake day, but they are required to call the CSR between 8:00am-8:30am to verify their intent to show for the appointment.

Consumers calling in the a.m. on the same business day may be given an appointment that day, depending on any open slots.

Consumers are given first come, first choice on open intake times based on the order of calls beginning at 8:00am. In the rare occurrence that all intake slots are filled, consumers will be given first priority on the next business day provided they call and inform CSR of their intent to show.

Medicare Only, Medicare/TennCare Referrals

Medicare only consumers will follow the same procedures as TennCare and Private referrals with the following exceptions:

The CSR upon completion of referral data sheet will inform the consumer of the Medicare intake appointment dates, which is based on limited providers at the respective site. The Medicare consumer will be asked (required) to call on that Medicare scheduled day to confirm attendance (between 8:00am and 8:30am).

Private Insurance, EAPs, CEAPs, Contracts, Sites with Fairview Services

Private insurance, EAPs, CEAPs and other contracts for specific consumers are to be given a scheduled appointment within the guidelines of Frontier contracts or insurance requirements. In addition, the CSR ensures they are placed with an approved provider.

The consumers in the category are asked to call and confirm their intent to attend the appointment on the scheduled day by 8:30am.

Tennessee Department of Health Consumers

Consumers follow the same process as TennCare referrals and private referrals to access services.

When the consumer calls the next open intake day, between 8:00 and 8:30am, an appointment will be scheduled for one hour to complete the ASI and 30 minutes to begin the clinical intake. The CSR will notify the consumer that a total of two hours will be needed for the initial appointment to include 30 minutes for administrative paperwork.

 Please remember our #1 concern is always the consumer and their timely access to services. Every effort should be made to accommodate consumers presenting with special issues (i.e. DCS referrals, no phone, work restrictions, emergencies, etc.).

The following is the procedure a DCS worker should use to set up an initial appointment at Ridgeview Psychiatric Hospital:

For the children in Anderson, Morgan or Scott Counties, the worker should call 865-482-1076 and tell the receptionist that they wish to schedule an **intake appointment**.

For children in Roane County, they should call the Louise Singleton Center at 865-882-1164.

In Campbell County, the office number is 423-562-7426.

One of the reception staff will ask the worker for pertinent information such as full name, date of birth, social security number, address, phone number, type of insurance and who has custody of the child. A DCS worker must sign the consent to treatment forms and releases prior to the intake appointment. This can be done at the intake or the worker can come in prior to the scheduled time and fill out the papers. If no one authorized to sign these forms has done so by the time of the intake appointment, the child cannot be seen and another appointment must be scheduled.

Depending on the demand for our services at the time of the call, an intake appointment may be scheduled at the time of the initial call or the worker may be told that the case will be placed on a waiting list and they will be called as soon as an appointment is available.

INTAKE PROCESS

The worker will call 901-369-1400, and ask for the intake department, specifying that the client has never been seen as a patient before.

The call will be transferred to the intake coordinator who will take down pertinent information (psychiatric history, current problems/symptoms, insurance information, medical history, social security number, date of birth, address, phone number, etc.) and will schedule the initial intake appointment. The worker will be able to leave a message with a clerk if the intake coordinator is currently assisting someone else. The intake coordinator will then return the call and set up the appointment at that time. If the DCS worker has a problem with this process, they can call that same phone number and ask for Laurie Powell. It is important for DCS to understand that they must attend the initial intake and initial psychiatric evaluation appointment.

INTAKE PROCESS

All appointments for intakes are scheduled through the intake and referral line by calling 327-7009. It is best if the legal guardian or someone who can provide the necessary information call to schedule the appointment. Information you will be asked to schedule the apt include:

- Demographic information (child's name/DOB/SS #/address/ insurance information/PCP's name)
- Current of previous mental health treatment information.
- Brief description of current concerns / needs.

Callers will be asked to bring any information if available that might be helpful, such as previous evaluations, lists of any medications.

Intake appointments usually take 60-90 minutes to complete.

All children, including those in state custody, must be accompanied by their legal guardian. Individuals 16 years or older may sign their own paperwork, however we request that the guardian still attend the appointments and be an active participant. Documentation of custody will need to be provided in cases in which there are concerns/disputes about custody.

The intake process:

During the initial intake appointments, the child and guardian will meet with a Mental Health Therapist. During this appointment, information about the child will be obtained and initial treatment/service recommendations will be given. Services available at this clinic include individual and family therapy, and psychiatric/medication services.

Medication prescriptions are not provided at the intake appointment.
